

TITLE: Peer Teacher

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Florida teaching certificate.
2. Current employment in the school district.
3. Completion of State-approved Clinical Education training.
4. Three years or more of successful teaching experience.
5. Such alternatives to the above qualifications as the Board may find appropriate and acceptable.

REPORTS TO: Principal/Director or designee

JOB GOAL: To assist the new teacher with the completion of the beginning teacher A.P.P.L.E.S. program

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

1. Conducts three formative observations, including pre and post observation conferences.
2. Assists with the development and implementation of the new teacher's Professional Development Plan..
3. Submits to Staff Development all of the required paperwork.

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Participates in weekly consultations with the new teacher.
2. Provides a professional role model for the new teacher.
3. Performs related work as required (Note: The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related, or a logical assignment to that position.)
4. Adheres to school district policies and procedures.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

This position requires exerting up to 20 pounds of force occasionally and/or up to 10 pounds of force as frequently as needed to move objects.

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT:

Dates for the work year based on the district's school calendar. Work year will be 196 days and a supplement to be determined by Schedule B of the Teacher/District Contract.

ASSESSMENT:

The principal or designee will assess the effectiveness of the peer teacher annually with respect to the performance of the essential functions.
